Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition

(as simplified from TITLE 2 - Department of Agriculture - Division 30-Animal Health)

At the time of printing the following is the current set of guidelines for The Missouri Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition.

As all animals showing in the Linn County Fair are to be in the member's possession and care by designated dates, health regulations across state lines do not apply.

Designated dates:

Market Breeding Beef Cattle: March 1 June 1 Sheep: Market June 1 Breeding June 1 Swine: **Breeding Gilt** Market May 1 90 days **Breeding Boars Since farrowing**

Dairy Cattle June 1

Dairy Goats June 1 Market Goat June 1

Dogs April 1 Horse May 1

Bucket Calf: Born March 1 to May 15 of current year

In possession 2 weeks after birth

Rabbit/Guinea Pigs June 1 Meat Pen 5-10 weeks prior to show Poultry June 1 Meat Pen 8-10 weeks prior to show

HEALTH CERTIFICATES

- A. The term Health Certificate means a legible record made on an official form of the state which shows that the animal(s) listed meet the testing, vaccination, treatment and health requirements of the state. A health certificate must accompany all animals to be exhibited as stated below.
- B. Animals with active lesion of "ringworm" with resulting loss of hair or "warts" easily visible without close examination will not be permitted to exhibit.
- C. Animals with clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease will not be permitted to exhibit.

CATTLE

- 1. A health certificate is **not** required.
- 2. Brucellosis: No test or vaccination is required.
- 3. Tuberculosis: No test is required

SWINE

- 1. No certificate of veterinary inspection is required
- 2. BRUCELLOSIS: No test or vaccination is required
- 3. PSEUDORABIES: No test is required.

HORSE

- 1. All equine to be exhibited must be free of clinical sign of an infectious or contagious disease.
- 2. All equine require proof of a negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test by means of the "Coggins" test within twelve (12) months prior to exhibition.

DOG

1. All dogs must have their vaccination records up to date.

POULTRY

1. All poultry animals must be test pullorum-typhoid tested negative just prior to exhibition.

SHEEP

- 1. Sheep must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease
- 2. All sheep, including wethers, must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection or a paper copy of an electronic Certificate of Veterinary Inspection showing official identification (ear tag electronic implant or registration tattoo) as defined in Part 79 of the Code of Federal Regulations. If electronic implants are used for identification, owner/manager must provide electronic implant reader.

GOAT

- 1. Goats must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.
- 2. All goats, including wethers, must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection or a paper copy of an electronic Certificate of Veterinary Inspection showing official identification (ear tag, electronic implant or registration tattoo) as defined in Part 79 of the Code of Federal regulations. If electronic implants are used for identification, owner/manager must provide electronic implant reader.

RABBIT/GUINEA PIGS

1. Rabbits/Guinea Pigs must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.

Any animal showing clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease will be required to leave the fairgrounds by the request of the show chairman or the Fair Board.



131	<u>CARCASS CLASS:</u> All Barrows and Gilts in the Market Show are eligible. A fee will be charged for use of the machine to those with an entry in the class. Each exhibitor is limited to one animal in the class. Animals must weigh 230-290 pounds to compete for a placing.	


Swine Show Rules:

- 1. Any member may show
 - a. 4 Market Animals (Barrows and /or Gilts)
 - b. 8 Breeding Animals (Boars, Breeding Gilts, with no more than 2 animals in any one class)
- 2. a. Breeding gilts cannot be shown in the Market Hog classes.
 - b. Breeding gilts will be show by breed not home raised or purchased
- 1. <u>Original registration papers</u> for Purebred Breeding Gilt and Boar classes (purchased or home raised) are required to be shown to the chairman when checked in for animal to be shown in breed class.
- 2. Ear notch number (the Universal System) and the date farrowed or purchased are required on all hogs within a member's project that might be shown and must be turned into the Extension Office by June 5.
- 3. Bedding is allowed in the Hog Barn but it must be removed by the exhibitor at the end of the show.
- 4. Linn County Born and Raised hogs that are born in Linn County and exhibited by a Linn County 4-H or FFA exhibitor. There will be cash awards for the top Born and Raised Market Hog and top Born and Raised Breeding Gilt. Note separate class for these animals. Sign up for regular class where animal falls (Birthdate or Market) and class 116 (Linn County Born/Raised Breeding Gilt) or Class 126 (Linn County Born/Raised Market Hog) in FairEntry.

"PEE WEE" SWINE SHOW - may be cancelled due to CoVid 19

This special event has been set up for those who have not had any experience with swine. Any age guest is welcome to be matched up with fair exhibitors who have swine in the fair. The "Pee Wee" will take a hog into the ring with the help of the swine owner.

Interested "Pee Wee" showman will be signed up at the Parents discretion. Fair Board is not responsible for accidents.
