LEAD LINE

- 1. The purpose of this class is to present a class of beauty, to acquaint the public with modern sheep production and to promote the use of wool by demonstrating its beauty, versatility and source.
- 2. Entries in this class are open to anyone enrolled in the Linn County 4-H/FFA/ Fair.
- 3. All models must wear wool or wool blend outfits.
- 4. These outfits may be handmade by the exhibitor, by someone else or they may be purchased.
- 5. There will be three age groups, if there are 4 entries in each division, to be divided at the chairman's discretion (to better equalize the divisions). Be sure to have entry forms filled out and turned into the Sheep Chairman by noon on the day of the show or do not plan on showing.
- 6. If the exhibitor does not show sheep at the Fair they may team up with someone who has shown sheep at the Fair.
- 7. The person supplying the sheep will be responsible for having the sheep clean and fitted for show. They must also see that the sheep is halter broken.
- 8. Only yearling ewes, ewe lambs and wether lambs that have been shown at the Linn County 4-H/FFA Fair may be used.
- 9. The models will draw for modeling positions.
- 10. Entrants will be judged on the appropriateness and attractiveness of their garments, their poise and appearance and the control and presentation of the ewe or lamb.
- 11. Point value for this class will be 12-8-4.

Beef Fitting Contest Rules 2020

Wednesday – July 15 7:30 pm (following Lead Line)

- 1. The contest will take place in the livestock arena. All grooming supplies will need to be brought to the arena prior to the start of the contest. If for any reason the arena would be unavailable a secondary location will be announced prior to set up. Chutes will be lined up along the SOUTH Side of the Show Arena. After equipment has been set up; Parents, Guardians, other exhibitors not participating will need to relocate to the bleachers.
- 2. Only participants who are actively enrolled in the Beef Project category may participate.
- 3. Any Exhibitor receiving verbal assistance from anyone other than their partner will be disqualified.
- 4. Each team will begin with a clean, dry animal that has been clipped.
- 5. If exhibitors choose to use clippers during the contest, they may do so at their own risk.
- 6. Senior teams will have two members, both 16-21 years of age. The Senior teams will have 30 Minutes to Complete the fitting of their animal.
- 7. Junior teams will have two members, both 8-15 years of age. The Junior teams will have 30 minutes to complete the fitting of their animal.
- 8. Attire to be worn should be respectful of the standards set forth by the Linn County Fair.
- 9. Once time has been called, all teams must cease working on their animals. If fitting is continued after time is called, the team may be disqualified. The teams will be allowed a final comb-through of their animal before presenting to the judge.
- 10. The Judge may then take 5 minutes to ask questions of each team related to their animal, products, or fitting methods.
- 11. All rules are final with no negotiation until the 2020 fair has completed. If there is any requests of rule changes or additions it will be taken care of prior to the 2021 Linn County Fair.



LIVESTOCK PREMIUM SALE Saturday - July 18, 2020

- 1. Each exhibitor can sell only one market animal species (hog, lamb, market heifer, steer, poultry pen, rabbit pen, goat or ham).
- 2. Each sale animal must have been exhibited in a market class in the fair.
- 3. 4-H and FFA members can only participate in one premium sale Linn County or their other county of affiliation.
- 4. Sale will be by the head for the "Premium Price" only.
- 5. The member retains ownership of their animal.
- 6. Buyers may write one check to **Linn County "Livestock Sale"** for animal(s) "purchased". The sale clerk will in turn write checks to exhibitors to be passed out following clean-up day.
- 7. 10% of Premium Money plus \$20 for 2 prints (one for the buyer, one for the exhibitor) will be taken out of Premium Sale Check. \$10 of that 10% will go toward **ONE** Steak Feed ticket for the **MAIN** buyer of each sale exhibitor.
- 8. Market Lambs, Market Goats and Market Hogs may be male or female to sell.
